

Solid and Liquid Waste Management Plan for Remaining Villages in Prayagraj District

In Prayagraj district, out of 2,789 villages, 37 villages are yet to be covered under the Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM) initiative. A comprehensive action plan needs to be formulated to address this gap and ensure proper waste management in these villages.

To achieve systematic liquid waste management, the construction of soak pits and filter chambers will be prioritized. This will help in ensuring proper disposal of wastewater, preventing open drainage, and maintaining a hygienic environment. Additionally, in places where drainage construction is essential, necessary steps will be taken to build proper drainage systems.

Under solid waste management, waste collection centers (Kude Ghar) will be constructed in Gram Panchayats. Household waste will be systematically collected and transported to RRC centers or waste collection points, where Self-Help Group (SHG) women will be engaged in waste segregation and recycling activities. This initiative will not only promote environmental cleanliness but also empower rural women by providing them with livelihood opportunities.

With the implementation of this plan, villages will experience visible improvements in sanitation, ensuring a cleaner and healthier living environment for rural communities. Proper solid and liquid waste management will help in maintaining sustainable sanitation practices, reducing water contamination, and enhancing the overall quality of life in these villages.
